The fish is one of the earliest Christian symbols. Dating back to the first century, it was often used in covert communication between early Jesus followers who feared persecution by Roman authorities. The Greek word for fish, pictured here, is ichthys. This word is an acrostic for the words Iesous Christos, Theou Yios, Soter, which means "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour." It is also one response to our Lenten theme/question "Who do you say I am?"
