

FIRST CHURCH'S RESPONSE TO COVID-19

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear...

- Psalm 46

Dear Friends,

This week has brought home to all of us the vital importance of working together to slow and limit the spread of Coronavirus. Behind the scenes, church leaders have been meeting to consider how best to find our way forward. We know we are called to be a community of faith, not fear. We also know we are called to care for the most vulnerable in our midst, to be good stewards of our staff and resources, and to be good citizens of the wider community.

Under normal circumstances, people of faith would care for each other by drawing close together. It's what we do. It's who we are. In times of loss or threat, we respond by coming together to pray and to sing, to hug and hold each other tight.

Pandemics are different. During an outbreak such as the one we are facing now, we are called to care for each other by moving farther apart, creating a holy buffer of social distance. We do this not only for our own safety and the safety of the people around us, but in loving stewardship to our wider world.

For the next three weeks, at least, from March 16 to April 5 (Palm Sunday), all First Church-sponsored worship, meetings, and events will be postponed, cancelled, or shifted to online formats. All wider community events that are hosted at First Church will also be postponed, cancelled, or shifted to online formats during this time period. We will be revisiting this plan regularly, revising as needed, and communicating updates weekly.

While the risk of infection is still low, we have developed these precautionary steps as an act of social responsibility aimed at limiting the spread of the virus and ensuring that hospitals are not stretched beyond capacity. Our decisions are consistent with bold measures taken recently by Harvard, MIT, and other local organizations and businesses. Many are cancelling, postponing or shifting to online platforms for both large and small group gatherings as well as all classes. Efforts taken now to limit person-to-person transmission could have long term implications on the trajectory of the virus in the weeks to come.

In addition, our approach has been informed by recent conversations with experienced public health experts, including a First Church member who is a former CDC executive. We've been advised to:

- be proactive and avoid a "wait and see" mentality.
- be clear with our directives and timeframes to help reduce anxiety and confusion.
- work in concert with other faith communities for broader social impact

FIRST CHURCH'S RESPONSE TO COVID-19

For at least the coming three weeks, we will be shifting exclusively to online worship. We are grateful that our services are easily available via live-stream from our website. Worship leaders will convene as usual and conduct worship in the chancel. We will do our best to identify and make special arrangements for those members who may not have internet access or devices. We will also work hard to make the experience of worship as rich and meaningful as possible, given these unusual circumstances. We will communicate this plan via email and on our church doors.

All in-person church meetings and events held at the church will be suspended through at least April 5. We strongly encourage House Church gatherings and meetings planned at members' homes to meet remotely via Zoom or other online platforms. Our March Deacons and Executive Council meetings will be held on Zoom. Other committees are encouraged to follow suit. Please contact a staff member if you need help setting up Zoom calls or have suggestions for other meeting platforms.

The Friday Café leadership team has already decided to close the Friday Café, effective immediately and until further notice.

The First Church Shelter will remain open to guests and staff unless events dictate otherwise. The Newtowne School plans to remain open until receiving other guidance from the Cambridge Public School District. Other building tenants will continue to have access to their offices during adjusted building hours and will not have access to additional spaces for meetings or events. The building will close daily at 6 pm starting on March 16.

Outside groups currently scheduled to use our space will be notified that we can not accommodate groups of any size. Some may be able to postpone and reschedule. Others planning to use the sanctuary may be able to take advantage of live-streaming capabilities for a sharply reduced rate. Adjustments to regular building will be made accordingly, and we may experience some savings in utilities as a result.

Note: these changes will mean a hit to our building income. Director of Operations, Kirsten Manville estimated that cancelling events through the end of April could cost us up to \$10,000. We will need to address how to cover this loss.

Even when apart, we are not alone. God is with us, in every heartbeat, every breath: strengthening, comforting, and upholding us. Christ is with us, walking beside us, sharing our trials, speaking peace to our fears. The Spirit is with us, uniting us one to another across the barrier of physical distance. In the words of the old hymn:

When we are called to part, it gives us inward pain; but we shall still be joined in heart, and hope to meet again.

FIRST CHURCH'S RESPONSE TO COVID-19

In that spirit, we invite you to pick up the phone and call each other often in the coming weeks. Let's be especially mindful of those at greatest risk of isolation. Check in on each other. Pray by phone together. E-mail, send cards, set up video chats, and schedule meetings on Zoom. We will be offering regular opportunities to participate in a conference call led by Dan. This will be a time to share connection and prayer - stay tuned for more about that!

First Church staff, especially those with pre-existing conditions, will be encouraged to work from home as much as possible and to conduct business meetings via Zoom. First Church sextons and childcare staff will be encouraged to "clock in" as they usually would despite whatever temporary changes to building hours and having no infants or toddlers in worship. First Church Shelter may have requests for added personnel costs to cover potential gaps in coverage. Pastoral appointments and visitation will be considered on a case by case basis.

Here are some of the ideas we are considering for keeping us connected as a community:

- Extending our Lenten Prayer Partners and House Churches
- Extending our Pastoral Care Team outreach via cards and calls
- Developing an outreach/call list of members and friends who may be particularly affected by social isolation
- Offering online formation sessions and/or Bible study via Zoom
- Organizing weekly circles/calls with time for soulful check-in, prayer. or scripture readings
- Gathering in small groups in homes, as people feel comfortable and safe
- Offering grocery and errand runs for those who are particularly compromised.
- What others do you have that you are willing to put time and energy into making happen?

These are temporary measures only. They won't last forever. We will rejoice and celebrate all the more when we are able to come back together, to share stories of what it was like, to laugh, to cry, and to share hugs and handshakes again. Until then, day by day, let's hold one another in prayer.

PLEASE PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE! Good hygiene helps prevent the spread not only of coronavirus but also of colds and flu!

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water and for at least 20 seconds.
- Sneeze or cough into the crook of your elbow or a tissue, not your hand. Wash immediately after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, nose and eyes, with unwashed hands.
- Regularly disinfect surfaces frequently touched including keyboards, desktops, elevator buttons and door knobs.
- Use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid close contact with someone who is sick.
- Stay home if you are sick.

By following these practices, we can all work together to minimize the chance of spreading
