COMMUNITY PRAYERS

- We pray for patience, strength and healing for James Ross, who has been in the hospital since last Friday for the unexpected onset of pain and lack of mobility. He is undergoing tests and awaiting diagnosis.
- We pray for John McCarty's father Jim, who is in the hospital recovering from a stroke.
- We pray for Perry Neubauer, who is recovering at home after long-awaited kidney stone surgery.
- We pray for all who are in treatment for cancer: Pauline Fennel; Judith Semmler, Alice Napoleon Jones's mother; Penny Kilburn, Nancy Kilburn's mother; Karen Anne Zee's daughter Becky Collet, and her sons-in-law, Denis Collet and Stewart Bailey; Beth and Polly, Ann McCann's sisters; a current First Church Shelter guest; and friend of Homeless Ministries Brian O'Donovan.
- We pray for all who are facing severe, dangerous heat, droughts, and fires in Massachusetts, across the U.S., in Europe, and around the world.
- We pray for the people of Eastern Kentucky as they continue to recover from devastating flooding and mourn the loss of at least 30 lives.
- We pray for all those impacted by mass shootings and other incidents of gun violence that are occurring much too frequently in our nation. We pray for an end to this violence and the fear it instills.
- We pray for justice and peace as white supremacist hate groups target marginalized groups in more frequent protests in the city of Boston and around New England.
- We pray for all who have been affected by the monkeypox outbreak around the world, and for our public health officials, that they might mitigate the harm done to our public and individual health. We pray that all may access medical care without shame.
- We pray for those experiencing the loss of vital reproductive rights across the nation, and all those who care about them. We also pray for compassion, wisdom, grace, and courage, as the public discourse around abortion may cause each of us to wrestle with our own thoughts and feelings surrounding the complexities of this issue.
- We pray for the people of Ukraine and for people in war-torn areas around the world. We pray for all troops and civilians, and for bordering countries receiving refugees.
- We pray for all who are affected by COVID-19—those experiencing symptoms, those grieving the loss of loved ones, and those awaiting vaccines and boosters. We pray with and for anxious hearts, especially for educators, healthcare personnel, and other essential workers.

COMMUNITY PRAYERS

- We pray for all transgender and gender non-conforming people who are experiencing hostility, discrimination, and violence across the country, in connection with the increased number of legislative actions that negatively impact their civil rights.
- We pray with hope at the news of possible climate action included in recently negotiated legislation in the Senate. Endow our political leaders and all of us with the strength and courage needed for ongoing climate and environmental justice.
- We pray for the 14 men who are finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter, and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding food and listening ears. We pray for all who are experiencing deprivation and hardship in these uncertain times.

Rev. Matt Carriker, and Issa Bibbins and Tiffany Colston

Today, we welcome Rev. Matt Carriker, founding Pastor of Agape Spiritual Community in Waltham, a newer church “start-up.” Matt is an ordained United Church of Christ minister, author, spiritual coach, and retreat leader, who has been leading Agape since it was formed in 2014. Agape describes itself as:

a community of contemplatives in action, with devotional, heart-centered music and worship that fills our spiritual cups. As a pluralistic Christian congregation, Agape is centered on Jesus, while living into the affirmation that God is still speaking, and affirming that there is beauty, wisdom, and life found in all religions rooted in love.

First Church has supported Agape’s efforts through our Missions and Social Justice Committee and also voted to join with Matt and Agape in endorsing a UCC Synod Resolution in 2021 encouraging our denomination to become a church of contemplatives in action, with deeper roots for our justice ministries in the ancient spiritual practices our tradition offers. Matt will be preaching today and sharing a taste of Agape’s worship and life together. In addition, we warmly welcome our dear friend, Issa Bibbins, and his friend Tiffany Colston, who will be offering music for today’s service.

Summer Hours


Through the months of July and August, **Hybrid Morning Worship begins at 10:00 a.m.**, with pick-up choir meeting at 9:15 a.m.




