

COMMUNITY PRAYERS

- We rejoice with Kate Layzer and Don Johnson at the birth of their first grandchild Alejandra Katherine Rothenberg, born on Sunday, May 25, to parents Marlene and Sam Rothenberg.
- We pray for Holly Marple as she stays with family in VT during an extended housing transition.
- We lift up the Harvard University community, including people from our congregation, in the midst of a confrontation with the federal government over academic independence and freedom of speech.
- We pray for all who are living with significant health challenges and their families and caregivers: Poppy Coffin, who is experiencing Alzheimer's Disease; Carter West, who is experiencing a chronic neurological disorder; and Keith Manville, who has atypical Parkinsonism. We also pray for those in treatment for cancer: Betsy Opitz; Louise Higginbotham, Sarah's mother; Dana Hunt, Claire Morgan's mother; Ellen Smith, Devin Hansen's aunt; Judith Semmler, Alice Napoleon Jones's mother; Karen Anne Zee's daughter Becky Collet and her son-in-law Stewart Bailey; and Beth and Polly, Ann McCann's sisters.
- We pray for the thousands of people who have been detained and/or illegally removed from the US without due process, including Marcelo Gomes, a Milford High School student detained on his way to volleyball practice; the dozens of people on Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket detained on their way to work; and the many who are being detained at their immigration hearings. We pray for their families, and for all those who are living under the daily threat of detention. We pray for the future of our democracy, as we witness alarming abuses of power.
- We pray for all those who are experiencing economic uncertainty in these times of change and upheaval, especially as federal budget negotiations reflect the real potential for devastating cuts to Medicare, Medicaid and the SNAP program, among other vital supports for those in need.
- During this Pride Month, we continue to celebrate the dignity and worth of our trans and gender non-conforming siblings who are experiencing an onslaught of prejudicial discrimination condoned by the current administration. We affirm that all of us are beloved in the eyes of God, just as we are.
- We pray for those injured in a hateful, antisemitic attack on a peaceful gathering in Boulder, CO.
- We pray for people around the world trapped in cycles of violence and war, especially in Gaza, where people are starving; in Ukraine; in the Democratic Republic of Congo; and in the Kashmir region of India and Pakistan.
- We continue to pray for our earth and for all creation in the face of the climate crisis.

Drawing on the work begun by the Assets Group three years ago, the Parsonage Working Group has spent several months exploring the best ways to utilize the asset of the 44 Garden Street property and ensure long-term



housing support for our lead minister. Based on the rich discussions in a series of listening sessions over the past month, the working group is finalizing options for what to do with the Parsonage that will be presented at the Special Congregational Meeting on June 22. They will hold one final session on Sunday, June 15, at 10:00 a.m. that will provide an opportunity to discuss the options they will be recommending and to ask detailed questions even before the June 22 meeting. All are welcome and encouraged to attend!
