





- We pray for all those giving and receiving care, compassion, and needed services from First Church's homeless ministries, both in the First Church Shelter and at the Friday Café. We continue to pray and work for a just society where housing is recognized as a human right.

democracy and human rights. The organization is now planning to march again. And this time they're inviting as many lay people as possible to join for all or part of the walk, which will begin





Men's Breakfast


Saturday, September 6, 8:00 - 9:30 a.m., Harter Room
